

Q&A - JJ 2026 First Global Campfire

Questions and answers received during the call can be found below:

1. I want to support with radio activities. How can I join the radio subteam in your team? So, you are not renewing the open call this year?

Answer: No, we are not renewing the open call this year but we accept nominations/recommendations if you have anyone in mind. We also welcome your individual interests, so please do reach out to the event co-leads, Nika (nika.gorovska@scout.org) and Džanin (dzaninj@scout.org).

2. Please send the invites to both workshops asap the programme one and the one on 28th June.

Answer: Yes, these will be in your emails by 30 May at the latest.

3. I see lots of good plans/ideas for JOTI activities, but what about JOTA activities?

Answer: We continuously explore different ways to make radio scouting more accessible during the event by providing guiding resources on how to organise such activities locally. However, on the global level, it is difficult for us to have anything else on offer apart from downloadable activities and support for the World Scouting licensed radio stations, as radio scouting activities for JOTA-JOTI depend greatly on amateur radio equipment, expertise in utilising said equipment, as well as local laws and policies on radio communication that vary across the globe.

4. Will it be possible again for organisations to produce the badge on their own without paying fees?

Answer: NSOs do not need to pay any fees if they are producing badges for non-commercial use. However, in any case, NSOs must obtain a license from World Scouting if they wish to produce badges locally.

5. World Scout Shop closed. Where can we order badges?

Answer: NSOs are encouraged to produce badges locally this year while we look for an alternative for future editions of the event. NSOs must obtain a license from World Scouting to produce badges locally.
